Church of Christ Plans to Build in Riviera

Checking of plans for a new \$60,000 Church of Christ to be constructed in Hollywood Riviera, is expected to be completed by the Torrance Engineering Department in a few days. The second church in the Riviera was approved recently by the local art jury. Of contemporary modern architecture, the two-story structure will be on Pacific Coast Hwy. near El Retiro Park. It was designed by Richardson J. Twchy, of Palos Verdes.

Plans call for 6400 square feet, with adjacent parking lot in a 55 by 150-foot area. Building blocks, Palos Verdes stone, redwood, and crushed rock will be used in various parts of the church, although the color has not yet been determined.

The Rev. Raymond Ford is pastor of the congregation, which is meeting in the Redondo Beach Woman's Club at present. Much of the labor is expected to be voluntary. Inside the building, nine classrooms are planned for the low-

Methodists Dedicate New Building

Consecration services for the First Methodist Church's recently completed church school building was conducted by Bishop Gerald Kennedy at 7:30 p.m. yesterday.

After services in the church sanctuary, the group moved to the new building, where architect Robert Insee presented the building to Robert Reed, chairman of the building committee, who in turn presented it to trustee Earl Miller. Miller offered the \$80,000 building to Bishop Kennedy for consecration. Also present at the ceremonies was S. Douglas Walters, of Long Beach, district superintendent.

Of contemporary design, the building can house 300 Sunday School children. It contains two stories and a basement. A dining hall, which accommodates 130 people, is in the basement.
