

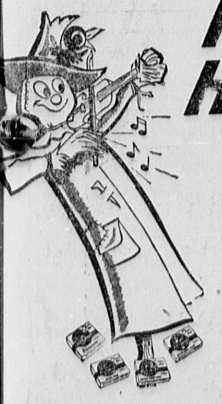

**Campaign for Army Reserve Enrollment Urged by General**

In an all-out drive to strengthen Army Reserve units throughout the western states, Lieutenant General Willard G. Wyman, Sixth Army Commander, has ordered the various military districts to formulate plans to secure greater participation in the Reserve program.

The program, to be implemented during the month of November, is designed to obtain additional officers and enlisted men for the hundreds of reserve locations located in the huge eight-state Army area.

In the local area, Fort MacArthur, headquarters of the Southern California Sub-District, will be a focal point for the recruiting program.

Officials point out that the Reserve unit is interested in obtaining the services of young men who have no prior service but are vulnerable for a reserve obligation in the huge eight-state Army area.

They also will stress membership by those persons who have incurred a current reserve obligation under the Universal Military Training and Service Act, and have served their two years of active training.

Some still have to fulfill an 8-year obligation.

Men can complete part of their obligation while a civilian, earning pay and learning an occupation or trade while training, it was stated.

Those with previous military experience who have no current reserve obligation can accumulate credits for retirement plus other benefits in the Reserve. The Army reported.
