Sin Topic of Lesson-Sermon

The necessity of overcoming one of the most important points in the theology of Christian Science." (pp. 39, 404). The Golden Text is from Psalms (130: 7): "Let Israel hope in the Lord; for with the Lord there is mercy, and with Him is plenteous redemption."
