

# Speakers Explain Hospital Needs

Members of the Torrance Toastmasters Club gave a series of short talks on the situation facing Torrance Memorial Hospital to the men and women attending the YMCA Good Neighbor Breakfast in the Civic Auditorium Saturday morning.

Led by Jim Lawson, master of ceremonies, John Willd, president of the Toastmasters, and Robert Owens, speakers bureau chairman of the Torrance Memorial Hospital Building Fund Campaign, several members of the Toastmasters Club spoke of the needs for modernizing and expanding Torrance Memorial Hospital.

and overcrowding which exist in the hospital, especially in the maternity departments, are the result of the tremendous growth in population of Torrance and the surrounding area.

**Hospital Demand Grows**  
The city has more than doubled in size since 1950 with an increasingly greater demand put upon the hospital. There has been no corresponding increase in the bed capacity of the hospital, the speakers said. There has been no substantial increase in the service facilities of the hospital since it was founded 30 years ago by the Torrance heirs.

The Toastmasters were assisted in their presentation of these facts by a large, three-panel display. It featured a large water-color sketch of the proposed new Torrance Memorial Hospital, modernized and expanded. Accident and disaster pictures in one panel of the display pointed up the need for hospital services.

**Sketches Show Plans**  
Text and blueprints of the architects sketches on other panels of the display described improvements and new additions to be incorporated in Torrance Memorial Hospital. These include a completely new maternity wing with two nurseries, two delivery rooms, three labor rooms and 20 beds for the mothers. Also, a new surgery wing was shown and other plans to modernize the hospital and bring its bed capacity up to 93. The display was prepared for the Torrance Memorial Hospital Building Fund Campaign, by Miss Charlene Clark of the high school art department.

Also presented at the meeting was a new brochure which has just been produced for the building fund campaign. It contains further information describing the hospital situation and the solution to it.

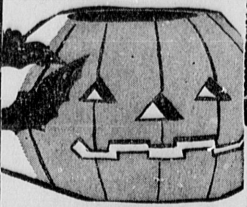
