

### Mayor Proclaims Forget-Me-Not Days for DAV

Forget-me-nots, the blue flowers of remembrance, will be distributed on the city's streets Nov. 8, 9, 10, 12, and 13 by members of the Disabled American Veterans, it was announced here this week.

Special recognition of the event was ordered by Mayor Nicholas O. Dralle at the City Council meeting last night when he proclaimed the days "Disabled American Veterans Forget-Me-Not" days.

Pointing out that it was the moral duty of every one to feel gratitude for those men and women who returned to civilian life with wartime injuries and handicaps, Mayor Dralle urged all citizens, interested groups, and societies to participate in the forget-me-not sales.

**Official Voice**  
The Disabled American Veterans is chartered by Congress as the official voice of the nation's wartime disabled, the Mayor pointed out in his proclamation.

It is to be commended for providing welfare assistance to disabled veterans and their families, free service in assisting veterans in their claims, employment, and hospital problems.

Sponsors of the fund drive locally is the South Bay Chapter No. 92 of the DAV. All funds collected during the campaign will be utilized for disabled veterans and their dependents in this area, Commander William Hardesty reports.

Torrance's share of liquor license fees for six months of 1954 was \$5,789, according to figures released by the State Board of Equalization.

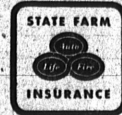
For the period ending Aug. 31, Los Angeles County's share of the distribution was \$295,630, of which \$671,911 went to the City of Los Angeles.
