

## Prompt Payment Of Vehicle Fees Urged by Tudor

es, taxicabs, and house trailers were urged today to renew their vehicle registration as soon as possible.

Leavitt Tudor, manager of the Torrance branch of the Department of Motor Vehicles pointed out that statement of fees due were mailed Dec. 1 for 1,000,000 of these vehicles.

"Prompt application will relieve crowding of the department offices during the regular renewal period, Jan. 3 to Feb. 4," he said.

Fee statements for over 5,000,000 private passenger car owners will be mailed on Dec. 27, for presentation with fees during the annual renewal period.

Tudor advised all owners to note that the 1955 statements are in the form of pre-punched cards designed for business machine processing, and must not be stapled, pinned, folded, torn or otherwise mutilated.

He said renewals can be speeded up if all applicants will print or type their names and addresses on the right hand stub of the cards before visiting their renewal offices.

He pointed out that persons applying for transfers of vehicle registration and ownership during December are required by law to pay the full annual fees year.
