Monrovia High School established itself as a power in Southland track and field circles Thursday, when its Varsity, B and C squads ran roughshod over prep teams from Torrance and El Rancho at El Rancho.

In the first meet of the season for all three schools, the Monrovia tracksters registered some outstanding marks. The winners took the Varsity meet with 65 points to El Rancho's 39 and Torrance's 25.

John Trenary took another second for Torrance in the varsity competition. He chased Cox of El Rancho home in the mile run. Trenary's time was 4:55.0, 3.9 seconds slower than the winner.

Top B Class scorers for the Tartars were Mickey Boskovich, Billy Meacham and Dick Dentwood. Boskovich ran second in the B 100-yard dash and was timed in 10.6 seconds. Meacham took another second for the Tartar Bee squad, as he toured the 660-yard run in 1:33.4. Dentwood was second in the Class B 120-yard high hurdles. He was timed in 14.9.
