FISH, GAME REGS BEGIN ON APRIL I

Regulations enacted by the Fish and Game Commission at its February meeting do not become effective until April 1, the commission reiterated recently in response to hundreds of telephone calls from impatient anglers.

The sole exception is the ban on retention of one undersized salmon, which went into effect March 10 as an emergency measure.
