## Traffic Deaths Highest For Juvenile Ages

Bring them up, don't run them down.  
California Highway Patrol Commissioner B. R. Caldwell today offered this suggestion in urging parents and motorists to make extra effort to safeguard children in traffic.  
Caldwell pointed out that one of every six persons injured in California traffic last year was a child under 16 years of age, while one of every eleven traffic deaths came from this same age group.  
"Almost 17,000 youngsters, age 14 or under, were either

killed or injured on our streets and highways during 1954," the Commissioner declared.  
"Parents and motorists must share the responsibility for this toll. Proper safety instruction is vitally important to the welfare of every child. It is equally important that motorists exercise constant alertness against the unpredictable acts of children," he cautioned.  
Citing the toll of 276 dead and 16,714 injured among children 14 or younger during 1954, the Patrol Commissioner offered a few simple rules de-

signed to help protect the youngsters:  
1. Expect the unexpected whenever children are in sight.  
2. Give bicycle riders every possible break.  
3. Drive with extreme caution near schools, playgrounds, residential areas, or other places where children play.  
"It's up to adults to raise the young," Caldwell reminded.
