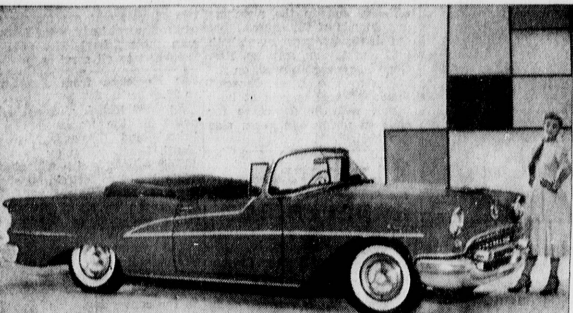
Former owners of a new car agency in Los Angeles, the Twins are out to break all sales records for a week end with the Carnival-type opening.
