## Gardena Valley Jewish Center Groundbreaking Sun. Afternoon

Groundbreaking ceremonies at the site of the planned Gardena Valley Jewish Center at 148th St. and Gramercy Pl. will begin at 2 p.m. Sunday.

The center will climax efforts of eight years to construct a gathering place for people of Jewish faith who wish to join in social, cultural and religious activities. It will serve as a central meeting place for families of Gardena Valley, where there is a potential membership of 350 families.

The Gardena Valley Jewish Center is composed of a Center group, a Sisterhood, and a Men's Club, with regular Center meetings held the fourth Tuesday of each month. Meetings have been held in homes in the past, and, more recently, in the Community Center. There is a Sunday School for young children, a teenage group, a men's baseball team and a bowling team.

High Holiday services were held last year in a rented hall, but prospects this year are for the services to be in the Center's own building.
