When it was discovered that the hospital had only two pints of type A2-B Negative on hand and the San Diego Blood Band three pints required for the op-reation, an appeal was made the appeal was harerart Red Cross by Douglas Airerart Company, El Segundo Division, where Ingersoll is employed as

11:30 a.m. Red Cross disclosed that type A-2B Negative occurs in only ono out of every 400 persons. and "starting from scratch" more than 1.200 persons ordi-narily would have to be screen-ed to obtain the three pints. "But with more than 500 in-dividuals giving their blood through Red Cross every day, an adequate supply of all types is available at all times," a spokesman said. 
