In making the report, Gris-wold pointed out that the district research projects include a variety of subjects of importance to an early solution to the smog problem.

"We are in the mopping up stages as far as local smog research is concerned," said Gris-wold, "and our big job is to apply present research findings to the Immediate job of controlling smog."

Now Four Projects
"At the present time, four major research projects are involving the most effort by district personnel. Each of these is of immediate importance to the control of the present air pollution problem."

Griswold said the projects were aimed at finding solution to the baffling auto exhaust pollution problem; an extensive air sampling and analysis program to identify an unknown contaminants in the local smog picture and to point out significant source areas of air pollution; laboratory and field analysis of specific contaminants emitted by various industrial-commercial operations; and meterological studies of wind patterns to determine their effect on smog formations and as a basis for future zoning of industrial plants in Los Angeles City.

Experts Retained

Instrument Corporation, and Consolidated Engineering Corporation.

Cooperation Cited Griswold explained that the Alf Pollution Control District is working very closely with all authorities in the air pollution field to avoid duplication of expensive and time consuming research and to expedite the development of needed, scientific knowledge on smog.

"Cooperative evaluation results in a more uniform understanding and agreement in a field that has been far too controversial." he said.
