**NOTICE FOR BIDS FOR FURNISHING AND INSTALLING OF CHAIN LINK FENCES**  
 Notice is hereby given that the Board of Education of the Torrance Unified School District of Los Angeles County will receive bids for furnishing materials, labor and services necessary to install Chain Link Fences at the Riviera Elementary School, 2555 Via Colina, Hollywood Blvd., Redondo Beach, Hillside Elementary School, 25600 Greenwood Blvd., Torrance, Newton School, 1851 Nancy Lane Lane, Torrance, Earl Steele School, 12900 Inglewood Ave., Torrance, and the North High School, 3620 W. 152nd Street, Torrance, California, as per plans and specifications on file in the office of the Business Manager, 2335 Plaza del Amo, Torrance, California. Each bid must be submitted on a form furnished by the Board of Education, must be sealed and filed in the office of the Business Manager, on or before Friday, August 12, 1955, 10:00 A.M., and will be opened and read in public at that time and place. Each bid must be accompanied by a certified or cashier's check for not less than 5% of the total amount of the bid. The above mentioned check shall be given as a guarantee that the bidder will enter into contract if awarded the work, or any part thereof, and will be declared forfeited if the successful bidder refuses to enter into contract after being requested to do so by the owner.

The prevailing rates as contained in the specifications are as follows:  
 Laborers ..... \$2.18  
 Steel Workers ..... \$3.10  
 Apprentices: May be employed in conformity with Section 1777.5 of the California Labor Code.  
 Foreman: Foreman shall not be paid less than 17 1/2 cents per hour more than the hourly rate of the highest classification over which he has supervision as to the basic trade, and not less than 12 1/2 cents per hour as to the sub-trade, more than the journeyman rate for the craft involved.  
 Overtime: One and one-half (1 1/2) times the above rates.  
 Sundays and Holidays one and one-half (1 1/2) times the above rates.  
 It shall be mandatory upon the contractor to whom the contract is awarded, and upon all subcontractors, to pay not less than the prevailing wage scale in accordance with the provisions of Section 1770 of the Labor Code to all workmen employed in the execution of this contract.

The successful bidder will be required to furnish Labor and Material Bond in the amount equal to 100% of the contract price, and a Faithful Performance Bond in the amount equal to 100% of the contract price. Said bonds shall be secured from surety companies satisfactory to the owner.  
 The owner reserves the right to reject any or all bids, or to waive any irregularity in any bid, and to determine the lowest responsible bidder. No bidder may withdraw his bid, check, or bid bond for a period of thirty (30) days after the date set for the opening thereof.

The City Council of the City of Torrance does ordain as follows:  
**SECTION 1:**  
 That Section 14 of Ordinance No. 512 be, and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto sub-section "K" which shall read as follows:  
 "K. The Planning Commission of the City of Torrance, on application therefor by an owner of owners of property affected thereby, may waive the provisions of Ordinance No. 512, as amended, so as to permit the construction of buildings or improvements which do not comply with the side yard rear yard and court widths applicable to said property."  
**SECTION 2:**  
 This ordinance shall be retroactive so as to make effective all waivers similar to such provided for in said sub-section "K" previously granted by the Planning Commission and the building permits issued by the City of Torrance, pursuant to such waivers, regardless of whether such waivers were authorized or permitted by any ordinance of the City of Torrance prior to the date of this ordinance.  
**SECTION 3:**  
 The Planning Commission of the City of Torrance is hereby authorized to delegate the power hereby conferred upon it, to issue the aforesaid waivers by and through a com-

missioner of three members of the Planning Commission appointed for such purpose, or through the Planning Director, or through the Secretary of the Planning Commission, in the absence of the Director.  
**SECTION 4:**  
 This ordinance is hereby declared an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, general welfare, and continued progress of the City of Torrance and this ordinance, therefore, shall take effect and be in full force immediately after the passage and adoption hereof.  
 The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance and shall cause the same to be published once in the Torrance Herald, a semi-weekly newspaper of general circulation, published and circulated in the City of Torrance.
