### It's Peach Time and Here Is a 'Peachy' Pie Recipe

This is the time of year when ripe, juicy peaches are in abundance. Preparing this seasonal fruit into recipes which delight the appetite, is the foremost question in the cooking world at the present. One highly pleasing way is a peach pie and as usual, one of our local housewives has come forward with a choice arrangement.

#### PEACH PIE

- Rich pastry
- 2 cups sifted flour
- 1 tsp. salt
- 3/4 cup shortening
- Blend dry ingredients. Cut in shortening until pieces are small. Mix egg yolk, milk and lemon juice. Stir into dry ingredients to make a soft dough. Turn out onto lightly floured surface. Divide dough for upper and lower crusts. Enough for a 10" double crust pie.
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1 beaten egg yolk
- 1 tsp. lemon juice, fresh
- 1/4 cup butter or oleo
- 3/4 cup nutmeg
- 1/4 tsp. lemon juice
- 1/2 tsp. butter or oleo
- 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
