CLINCH FLAG SUNDAY WITH 12-9 VICTORY

Gene Crenshaw, Mike Bertolot and Ken Simpson teamed up with their bats to provide the power as the Seals dumped the Oaks, 12-9, Sunday, and thus nailed down the pennant in Babe Ruth League play.

The Oaks were a single game back of the loop leaders and needed a win to throw the race into a tie. They were beaten this week by the Angels, 3-2, to add insult to injury.

Crenshaw homered in the sixth inning when the winners rallied for four runs to grab the game out of the fire. He had two hits in five trips to the plate, as did Mike Bertolot and Simpson.

Doug Ingram highlighted a six-run sixth inning for the Seals by smashing a bases full home run. Both teams got 10 hits.

Crenshaw was the winning pitcher. The Seals jumped into the league lead at the outset this year and were never headed.
