

Few desserts offer such "eye appeal" as does the lemon pie with its mountain of frosting over lemon filling made to just the risht degree of firmness. It takes a master blending of ingredients, coupled with the aim to please. LEMON FLUFF PIE ¼ cup sugar 1 cup water, cold

LEMON FLUFF PIE 4 cup sugar 1 cup water, cold 1 Tbsp. of flour 4 esg yolks 1 lemon and grated rind. A dash of salt Combine sugar, flour, lemon juice, rind, water, salt, egg yolks in top of double boiler. Stir all together with mixer for a few minutes until well mixed. Then cook until thick.

MERINGUE Whip four egg whites until stiff; add one-fourth cup sugar, whip until well blended. Take about one-half of meringue and stir into hot lemon custard. Pour custard into a baked pie shell. Top with rest of meringue. Sprinkle top with one-half teaspoon of susar. Bake in 350 degree over about 12 or 15 minutes.
