Chest Seeking 716 Volunteers

Phillip Lisman, Torrance Community Chest campaign chairman, yesterday called for 716 volunteers in Torrance to join in the Chest's crusade of "preventative financing." Volunteers from Torrance will form part of the 88,000 Red Feather workers called for recently by W. Herbert Allen, campaign healtman for all Los Angeles.
