

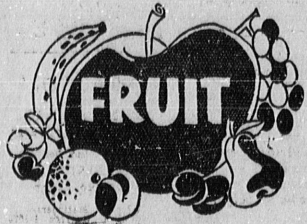

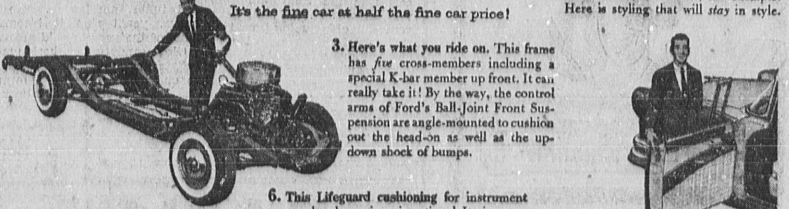

Apprentices may be employed in conformity with Section 1777.5 of the California Labor Code.
It shall be mandatory upon the Contractor to whom the contract is awarded and upon all subcontractors under him to pay not less than the prevailing wage scale in accordance with the provisions of the California Labor Code, to all workmen employed in the execution of the contract.
