### Slow Driver Said Hazard On Highways

Slow driving and failing to drive in the proper lane are two hazardous practices that are becoming more frequent on California streets and highways according to information released today by the California Highway Patrol. "An increasing number of drivers are using passing lanes as driving lanes on our multiple lane roadways," declared Deputy Commissioner R. R. McDonald. "This is contrary to the law requiring motorists to drive in the lane nearest the right shoulder or curb except when passing or preparing to make a left turn."

"Another errant driver is he who drives slower than the normal speed of traffic, hindering back those who are desirous of driving at or near the legal speed," McDonald said. "This is always very dangerous as well as illegal on any highway at any time. Although the driver of the slower moving vehicle is seldom directly involved in an accident, he is the main contributing cause of many serious accidents. The best policy for all drivers is to drive right and keep right, moving with the normal speed of traffic making use of the left lanes only for passing or when preparing to make a left turn."
