# Business Booms During Second Quarter of 1955

Business boomed throughout California during the second quarter of 1955, according to statistics released by Robert E. McDavid, Fourth District member of the State Board of Equalization.

Retail sales subject to the Sales and Use Tax were almost 18 per cent higher than those of the corresponding quarter of last year and were 3 per cent greater than the previous all-time record.

Tax on second quarter sales amounted to more than \$134,000,000 and brought the total 1954-55 fiscal year Sales and Use Tax revenue to an all-time high of more than \$492,800,000.

Los Angeles County retail sales for the second quarter of 1955 were in excess of \$2,000,000,000 producing more than \$600,000,000 in Sales and Use Tax revenue.

Building material dealers and hardware stores also showed substantial gains. Garden supply stores were the only business in the county that reported a smaller volume than last year.

Farm implement dealers in Los Angeles County reported a business volume increase of almost 49 per cent over last year.
