GARDENER'S CHECKLIST

Sow these seeds in the open ground: Alyssum, Virginia stock, baby blue eyes, scabiosa, godetia, calendula, clarkia, scarlet flax, and linaria.
All gladiolus should be lifted by this time.
Store in shallow trays. Dust the bulbs with lindane or DDT to kill the thrips.
Flant spring flowering bulbs, such as tulips, hyacinths, daffodils, and ranunculus.
Plant regular or spring flowering sweetpeas now.

crowed, the outer roots may be gently loosened with fingers. The plant should then be placed in the hole with the root ball about one inch higher than the surrounding soil surface, and the mixed soil should be placed around and tamped firmly when the planting is finished, water slowly and thoroughly. Proper watering of the cam-ella is very important. A plant in light soil will need more wa-ter than one in a heavy soil; and a plant in the shade will require less water than the one in the semi-shade; and a plant protected from the wind will roquire less water than on e which is not protected. There-fore, no exact rule can be laid down. The guiding principle is that a camellia should never be allowed to dry out complete-ly, and the soil should be kept moist but not so wet as to cause a wateringge condition. When watering soak the ground theroughly and do not water again until the plant s shows need for water by th fact that portions of soil around the plant have beguin to dry
