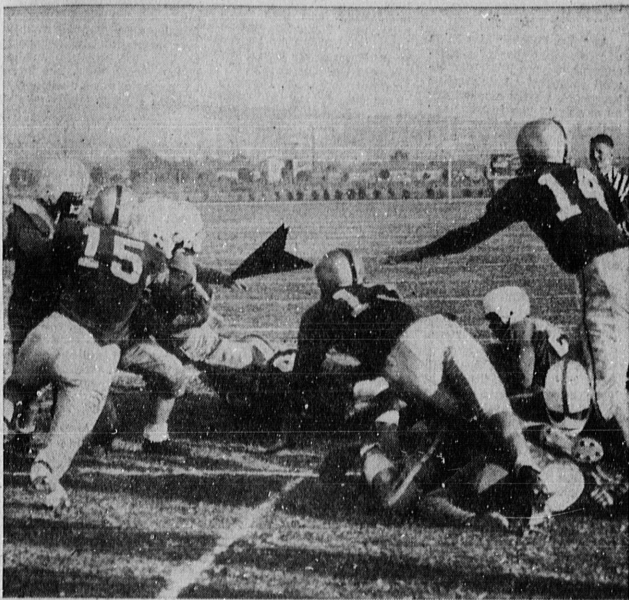
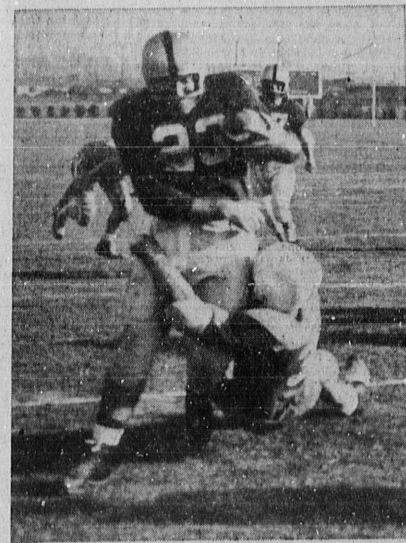


North Axed By Culver City In Pioneer Fray

Markham, who came here from Orestimba High School in Newman, said last week he'll rely mostly on Rich Ruffell, Mike Kendall, Ron Waller and Jerry Mathews, Ruffell, at 6'2", is the tallest cager. All four are up from last year's Tartar JV five.

Saxon Coach Bill Wood said that Ron Pettrell, a combination Varsity and JV cager last year at Torrance, and Dave Scott are the best on the squad right now. Wood coached Bee basketball last year at cage-happy Ventura High.

The Saxons, who travel to Bellflower Nov. 23, now are working out at the National Guard Armory and Alondra Park. They will be without a home court this season as the new NHS gym is lagging in construction.

Wood indicated that Roger Snell and Ron McCracken, both Saxon gridders, should help the cage cause when the football schedule is finished this week end.
