Christmas cookies with a Swedish flavor are being offered in today's recipe column. They are known as "Drommar" or Dream Cookies. The recipe is authentic, having been provided by a visitor from Varmland, Sweden, Miss Agda Larson, who with Mrs. Marie Swanstrom of Chicago have been houseguests at the home of Mrs. Swanstrom's son and wife, Mr. and Mrs. Carl Swanstrom, 17317 Prairie.

The amount given by Miss Larson makes 70 cookies. Drommars are popular in every Swedish home during the Yule season.

1 cup butter
3/4 cup sugar
2 tsp. vanilla

1 tsp. baking powder
2 cups flour
35 blanched almonds

Brown butter slightly and pour into bowl. Place over cold water and cool. Add sugar and stir until fluffy. Add vanilla, then flour and baking powder sifted together. Work dough until smooth. Roll out into small balls. Place on buttered baking sheet with half almond on top each. Bake in slow oven, (250 degree) until golden brown. Bake about 30 minutes.

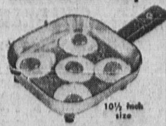
