LAW IN ACTION

ifornia's law went into effect last September.

This law does not undermine any state law; it says "the rights herein created are in addition, to, and not in substitution for any other rights."

The new law declares: Each man shall support his wife and his child, and when in need, his parent. Each woman shall support her child; and when in need her husband or parent. Natural or adoptive, the child is any son or daughter under 21, or one of whatever age without sufficient means who is "incapacitated from earning a living."
