The 1956 California license plates made their first appearance on local streets this week, as the Department of Motor Vehicles began issuing the new tags, but only to owners of new cars, recently-purchased cars, and out-of-state transfers.

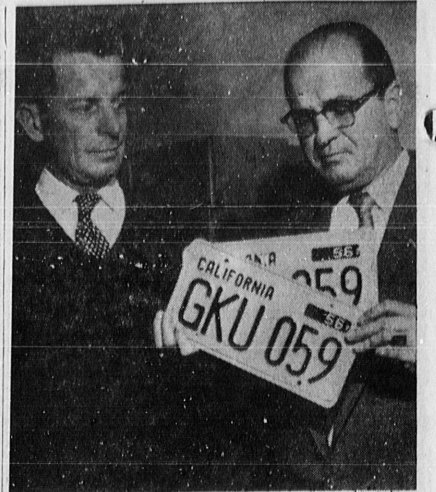
To date, the local office, 1817 Cravens Ave., has received 20,000 of the plates, which are black numbers on yellow plates. Under the new numbering and lettering system, the local office has received plates from GPU 000 to GLP 999. More plates will be received later, Tudor said.

Renewals of 1955 license plates will not begin until Jan. 3, Tudor said, and will continue until Feb. 4. Slips from the State, which are required for the re-registrations will be mailed on Dec. 20. Commercial and trailer registrations already have been mailed, Tudor said.

No special preference will be given to anyone in the issuance of the lettered plates, Tudor emphasized. Plates will be issued on a first-come, first-served basis, he said. Persons who want plates with their initials or special letters may get them by chance, he declared, but no plates can be reserved.
