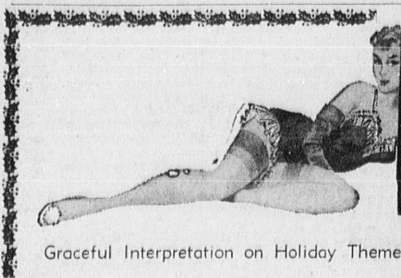


TAYLORS PLAN OPEN HOUSE THIS SUNDAY
