Ford Foundation Gives \$45,200

Torrance Memorial Hospital will be the recipient of a \$45,200 grant from the Ford Foundation, it was disclosed Monday. Members of the Torrance Hospital Board expressed great pleasure when informed of the grant, which was part of a \$500 million grant made to private hospitals and schools in all parts of the country.

Bids will be opened Friday for the hospital addition, which will expand present facilities to include 93 beds, delivery and labor rooms, nurseries and complete maternity facilities, major and minor surgery rooms, fracture and accident treatment comms, X-ray facilities, and a sterilizing and supply center. Also planned are administrative additions and other improvements.



Two teen-agers are being held by police today and a third one is sought following an all-day orgy Monday during which two Gardena girls aged 13 and 15 were held captive in a Torrance home for nearly three hours and

suffocated in her home early Sunday morning from smoke fumes after a fire started in a divan.

Fire department officials say the smoldering blaze apparent by started from a lighted cigarette.

Police and fire department rescue units were called to the house at 7:46 a.m. Sunday. They said the home was filled with smoke, although little damage was done to the structure.
