## Educators OK Victor Tract School Vote

Approval of a proposal to allow residents of the Victor tract to vote on a change of school districts at the same time they decide whether to annex to the city of Torrance was given Tuesday night by the Torrance School Board.

A letter from the City Council has asked the Board's approval of such a plan. The city has authorized the circulation of petitions in the Victor tract asking that the area, now county territory, be annexed to Torrance.

If enough signatures are obtained, the residents of the area will vote on the annexation proposal, and at the same time, decide whether their children should attend Torrance Schools. Children in the area now are attending Redondo Beach schools.

Approval of the Redondo School District and the South Bay Union High School District must be obtained for the election. Little opposition from these groups is expected.
