Decorations, informal entertainment, and the entire dinner from entree to cafe espresso will be in true Italian manner.

And now for the tempting

BAKED LA SAGNA

Cook 1 lb. La Sagna noodles as directed on package.

(Mrs. Fiorelli adds 2 tbsp. olive or salad oil to prevent sticking). In the meantime, mix 1 lb. ricotta with 4 eggs, 2 tsp. salt and pepper, ½ cup grated Parmesan cheese, 1 1 tbsp. parsiey and 1/3 mazzarella, which has been grated on a coarse grater.

When La Sagna is cooked, drain the boiling water and fill with cold water. (This prevents noodles from sticking together and facilitates handling).

In a 3-inch deep baking pan or casserole, alternate layers of sauce, noodles, ricotta mixture and meatbalis and Italian sausages, which have been cooked in tomato sauce and chopped into several pieces. (For sausages neither too hot nor too sweet, request that fennocchio seed be omitted). End with sauce on top and sprinkle with grated cheese.

Bake in 350 degree oven about 30 minutes. Serve with additional meat balls, sauce and grated cheese.

Other than the flavor, the nicest thing about this dish is that it actually is improved by setting and re-heating the next day.

MEATBALLS AND TOMATO SAUCE Mix together:

1 lb. ground beef

- tbsp. chopped parsley heaping tbsp. grated Parmesan cheese clove crushed garlic
- eggs
- 2 eggs
 4 tbsp. milk
 2 handsful bread crumbs

2 handsful bread crumbs
Salt and pepper (use plenty)
Mix thoreughly and form into round balls (about 12)
and fryin heavy skillet in 1-inch olive or salad oil. Brown
evenly. Remove from pan and set aside. Pour off half of
the oil. In remaining fat, saute 1 carrot, ½ sweet pepper
and ½ onion (all chopped). Add one large can tomatoes
(which have been forced through a sieve), 1 can paste, 2
small cans water, 1 clove garlic, and i bay leaf. Cook in
skillet for about 10 minutes. Then place all ingredients
except meat balls in large sauce pan (1 lb. sausages may
be added here), Simmer 30 minutes. Add meatballs and
simmer for 1 hour.




