Mr. Lippincott has been production, estimating and planning engineer at the San Pedro plant of Todd Shipyards Corp. He has been promoted to assistant general manager of the New Orleans division of the company as of Dec. 1. John S. Smith, Jr., New Orleans' general manager, said the move was part of the company's program of augmenting its engineering staff at the plant due to increased activities in the repair and conversion of ships and many other types of vessels and marine equipment. Mr. Lippincott has a broad background of many years of engineering experience in shipyard and allied industries. After his graduation from Armour Institute of Technology, Chicago, with a BS degree in civil engineering, and early employment with the Illinois State Highway Department and with the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul, and Pacific Railroad, he joined the Metal and Thermit Corp., as sales engineer.

He served as associate welding engineer at the Norfolk Naval Shipyard and later joined the staff of the supervisor of shipbuilding at the Todd-operated plant of Los Angeles Shipbuilding and Drydock Corp. at San Pedro.

Upon his release by the Navy Department, he joined the staff of Todd as welding engineer for San Pedro and Gulf yards. Subsequently, in 1945, when Todd purchased the San Pedro plant, Lippincott remained with the organization and has served in

many key positions in production, estimating, and planning. Among the recent projects he handled was that of supervising the repair and lengthening of the wrecked T-2 tanker Ticonderoga.

He was also responsible for the handling of planning and production on all government work at that plant.

"Home, Safe Home," a film showing the common hazards about the home and gives suggestions for improving safety in the home, has also been booked for the same day.

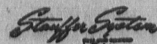
Prospective mothers are invited to the class which is an educational service of the County Health Department.

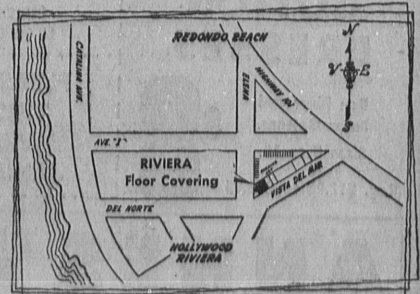
