

March of Dimes Appeal Voiced By Biscailuz

By the end of 1955, a total of 950 children and adults in Los Angeles County were stricken by polio, Sheriff Eugene Biscailuz, general county chairman for the March of Dimes, revealed this week.

Although the incidence is lower than that of previous years,

Biscailuz said, financial aid given by the Los Angeles Chapter of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis remains nearly constant because of the hundreds of persons, stricken in previous years, who still require assistance.

"Recently great advances

have been made in the prevention of poliomyelitis by vaccination with the Salk polio vaccine promising a brighter future with polio finally conquered.

"However, that time is not here yet. Until it is possible for millions of people to be vaccinated, polio will continue to strike and patients still need to be treated," he declared.

Biscailuz also pointed out

that considerable sums will be required for the treatment of both those who have been stricken, and those who will be in the future.

"In this 11th hour, let us not forget those who still desperately will need our help. Give generously to the March of Dimes this January," Biscailuz asked.

For Fourth Year

Afton Named Southwest Area Chairman for Red Cross Drive

Frank Afton, Inglewood auto dealer, this week was named Southwest Regional chairman for the 1956 Red Cross fund raising campaign, and in view of the northern California flood emergency immediately announced plans for a "speed-up" campaign to "bring in funds early when they are most clearly needed."

Afton's acceptance of the post, announced by Bruce W. McPheeters, Los Angeles' overall fund chairman, marks his fourth successive year as chairman of the Southwest Regional campaign, which, last year, achieved a 100 per cent goal. Communities included in the Southwest Region are Torrance, Gardena, Lomita, Palos Verdes, South Bay, El Segundo, Inglewood, Lennox, Hawthorne, Lawndale, and South Los Angeles.

"Rapid selection of top leadership for this campaign is our goal, in view of the added financial burden which the flood imposes on Red Cross in its program of helping people," Afton declared. "We intend to put together a fast moving organization of volunteers who will get into the field early and finish the job ahead of any previous schedule."

"Just a few hundred miles from Los Angeles' front door, Red Cross today is starting the tedious task of returning thousands of families to normal status in an aftermath of the Christmas holiday floods which ravaged northern California, southern Oregon and parts of Nevada," Afton pointed out.

"The floods have left the headlines, but the days ahead will find Red Cross — with more than 300 trained disaster relief workers in the field — spending in excess of \$8,000,000 in rebuilding and repairing homes, providing furniture, food and clothing and underwriting long-time nursing and medical care on a need basis," Afton said.

"It is imperative that Red Cross scores over-the-top results in our own area and across the nation in its 1956 fund campaign," Afton emphasized. "The American people — by giving generously in past fund appeals — made it possible for the Red Cross to assure all-

out assistance to stricken families along the West Coast no matter what the ultimate costs might be."

"Need Fast Action" "Red Cross today is scraping the bottom of the barrel in financing the relief work in flood-stricken communities from Vassalla north into Oregon," Afton underlined. "Red Cross' only source of income is from your donation and mine and those made by our co-workers and neighbors. To know exactly where we stand financially, this year's drive must be wrapped up successfully in as short a time as possible. I feel confident that residents of Los Angeles and vicinity will respond generously when called upon to give."

The spring campaign will not only assist in the current flood relief project in the Western States, but also keep all other Red Cross programs at peak strength, Afton explained.


