"The California Highway Patrol emergency telephone number, 2E-ninth 13000," is for traffic emergencies only," Caldwell declared. "Many times the non-emergency calls are for road and weather information or requests for the best route to some remote area or community."

Traffic emergencies are generally traffic accidents involving injury or death, blocked highways, drunk driving and highway incidents endangering lives or property," the Commissioner continued. "Non-emergency calls are to be made over the regular telephone listed for the office in the area from which the call is made."

"We urge everyone to remember this and help keep the Patrol emergency phone open for real traffic emergencies," he concluded.

First Fuselage Of New AD-7 Skyraider Here

The first fuselage for the new AD-7 Skyraider has arrived at Douglas-Torrance from Interstate Engineering Corp., at El Segundo as production gets under way on this latest version of the Navy's famed Skyraider series.

Approximately 3000 of these carrier based attack bombers have been built since 1946 along what has been termed a "thousand mile production line" extending from Torrance and El Segundo to Reno, Nev.; and Fresno, Hayward, and Burbank.

Assemblies for the latest Skyraider are manufactured by subcontractors and delivered to both facilities of the El Segundo division.

Torrance receives the fuselage and center wing sections where they are joined together and all installation work completed. They are taken next to El Segundo for final assembly.

In outward appearance, the AD-7 resembles the AD-6, however, its new equipment and performance are considerably improved.

Deliveries to the fleet are expected to begin in August of this year.

Forms for Reporting Income Tax Described by District Director

With the Federal income tax filing period in full swing, the office of the District Director of Internal Revenue is swamped with questions from taxpayers as to the most advantageous form for them to use in making their return.

The simplest form that is available is Form 1040-A, which is limited to reporting gross income of less than \$5000, all of which must be from wages that are subject to withholding, and other income not to exceed a total of \$100 from one or all of three other sources: wages not subject to withholding, or interest, or dividends.

If a husband and wife are both employed their combined income must be less than \$5000; and in California, because it is a community property state, they must file a joint return if Form 1040-A is used. In using the simplified Form 1040-A, the taxpayer does not determine his tax, but this is done for him by the District Director.

Short Form 1040 may be used by taxpayers whose adjusted gross income is less than \$5000, but there is no limitation as to the sources of income that may be used. Furthermore, husbands and wives may file separate returns if it is to their advantage to do so. Again, because California is a community property state, such separate returns must report one-half of the combined income of both husband and wife, on each separate return. The taxpayers who use this form determine their tax by use of the tax table, which is printed on the last page of the Instruction Booklet which accompanies the blank forms, and which automatically allows approximately 10 per cent of the adjusted gross income in lieu of itemized deductions, and which makes allowance for the number of exemptions to which the taxpayer is entitled.

Long Form Useful
The long Form 1040 must be used by taxpayers whose adjusted gross income is \$5000 or more, and may be used to report income of any amount below that figure. Use of the long Form 1040 permits the taxpayer to itemize his non-business deductions; and in every case in which such deductions total more than 10 per cent of adjusted gross income, it is advantageous to use the long form. In cases in which use of the long form is required because adjusted gross income totals \$5000 or more, if the taxpayer does not have non-business deductions which equal 10 per cent of his adjusted gross income, he is permitted to use

Changing Times Have Brought Us Many Startling Medical Advances

The changing times have brought much unrest to the world, the growth of national hatreds, and a lack of peace, but there are nevertheless many things for which all of us in this country can be grateful. Among our blessings, in particular, are the achievements which relate to health.

In the 17th Century Thomas Hobbes, the English philosopher, could only say that the life of man was "nasty, brutish, and short." Today, however, much of the filth and nastiness of living have been removed, the brutishness in the relationship between men has been largely erased, and the life span has increased so appreciably that, in the next decade or two, the average length of life in the United States may extend quite comfortably beyond the biblical three score and ten.

Vaccine Successful
In many ways medicine has learned the methods to prevent illness, both through the control of our environment and by immunization against specific diseases. The most recent achievement of this kind, of course, was the successful application of a vaccine in the prevention of poliomyelitis.

Surgery, too, has made almost unbelievable progress in the development of skills, and operations which only a few years ago were accepted as being next to impossible are now performed regularly. The days are truly gone when

man had to concentrate grimly in an attempt to survive, as long as possible against expected ill health and early death.

Enters New Era
Indeed, it is quite likely that we are entering a new era of health. For although, among other diseases, we have yet to conquer cancer and a variety of heart ailments, no man can say that these victories are impossible nor that they are immeasurably removed in time. The progress of medicine is cumulative in its effects, and the concerted efforts of the universities, the voluntary health agencies, the philanthropic foundations, and the various Institutes of the U. S. Public Health Service make the conquering of any disease less in the hands of chance than ever before in history.

U. S. Not Alone
Nor should we forget that this country does not stand alone in the achievement of such progress by scientists. To name but a couple, it was the initial work of the universities and synthetic drugs in Germany that made possible the gift of sulfa drugs to the world. And it was through the brilliant work of an Englishman, Alexander Fleming, that the door to the whole spectrum of antibiotics was opened.

Given freedom from drugery, ignorance, and the killer diseases man should finally be able to begin a great adventure in living which may permit him to concentrate on the social and individual values which, in the opinion of many, have been too long neglected.
