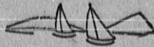

The orchestra numbers among its members professional musicians, former professional artists, business men and students planning musical careers.

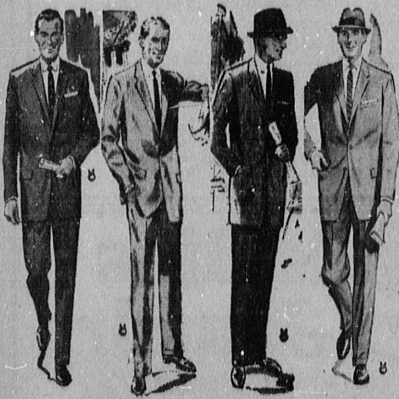

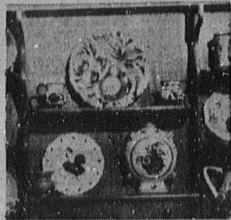
