# On Year's Taxes

Torrance's biggest taxpayer, General Petroleum Corp., Friday, presented H. L. Byram, Los Angeles County Tax Collector, with a check for \$2,136, 404.67 as its first installment on the 1986-57 L. A. County property tax bill. Of this total, \$509,084 will go to the city of Torrance and the Torrance Unified School District, A. E. Thompson, manager of the General Petroleum Corp. refinery, said.

The total General Petroleum 1955-57 Los Angeles County property taxes (first and second insallments) going to the City of Torrance will be \$258,-506 and the total taxes to the Torrance Unified School District will be \$556,552.
