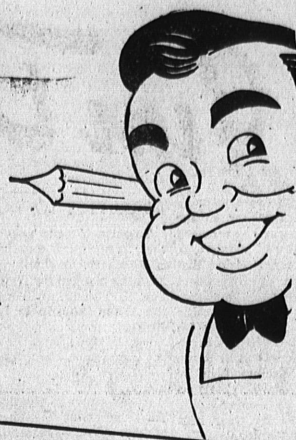

East-West Problems, CBS Film, to Be Shown Feb. 13

League of Women Voters of Palos Verdes Estates will present for community viewing a movie prepared by Edward R. Murrow and his CBS staff entitled "Year of Crisis: 1956," in the Malaga Cove Auditorium on Feb. 13 at 8 p.m.

The league is offering this analysis of the momentous problems of East-West relations and its many diverse aspects around the world in support of their belief in the principle of cooperation with other nations in solving international problems and in promoting world peace.

In this film, the CBS newsmen pool their knowledge gained by intimate contact with the world areas to which they are assigned, making a comprehensive report of the year's major news developments. The program was originally presented by Edward R. Murrow and his staff Dec. 20, 1956, on CBS radio and television facilities.

The film, pertinent to present international situation, discusses such questions as: Who won and who lost in the Suez and Hungarian ven-

tures?; How did we arrive at the place we are now?; and is the chance of war increased or decreased because of recent happenings?

A brief summary of President Eisenhower's resolution on the Mid-East by Mrs. George Gleghorn, first vice president of the local league, will conclude this foreign affairs program. An informal coffee period will follow. The community at large is invited to attend.
