

Mason Case New Fiesta Chairman

Plans for the 11th annual Fishermen's Fiesta got under way yesterday with the announcement of the appointment of Mason Case as Fiesta general chairman.

Case, who served as vice chairman of the 1957 Fiesta committee, is general manager of the Fishermen's Cooperative Assn. He said that dates of the traditional autumn event, which is sponsored by the San Pedro Chamber of Commerce, will be announced shortly.

Highlights of the annual pageant include the solemn blessing of the Los Angeles Harbor fishing fleet and the colorful parade of decorated fishing boats. More than a quarter of a million visitors annually witness the brilliant pageant which symbolizes the seafaring heritage of San Pedro.

Case has been general manager of the Fishermen's Cooperative Assn. since 1954. He came to San Pedro in 1953 to head a small boat association on Terminal Island and in San Diego and subsequently helped establish the Fishermen's Co-Op which represents 1500 boat owners.

Moose Seek Stiffer Laws On Narcotics

The Torrance lodge of the Loyal Order of Moose formally endorsed by resolution this week of Assembly Bill No. 9, which would revise a state law and calls for an increase in the minimum and maximum penalties imposed on adults convicted of selling narcotics to minors, according to Daniel Desmond, governor.

Action on the California Assembly bill followed four years of effort on the part of the Torrance lodge to initiate action to revise state statutes dealing with illegal narcotics traffic.

The bill, introduced in the California legislature early this year, and officially described as "An Act to amend Section 11714 of the Health and Safety Code," would impose a minimum five-year sentence and a maximum life imprisonment for a first offense, and a 10-year minimum sentence and a maximum death penalty for a second offense.

Other lodges, fraternal organizations, veterans' and service groups are asked, in the Moose resolution, to consider such endorsement and to forward the results of their action to the appropriate Assemblyman or state Senator.
