Lutherans Start Building Work

Excavation work is under way for a new \$60,000 educational building at the First Lutheran Church, Carson and Flower, according to the Rev. Paul Wenske, pastor.

Official groundbreaking ceremonies for the new building will be held this Sunday at 3 p.m. Services will begin in the church sanctuary, followed by the actual ceremonies in the area just south of the church. Because of this service, there will be no Vespers service in the evening.

Moine Bros., local excavators are preparing the ground, and Eilbert Voge, contractor, will begin construction work as soon as this is done.

The new building will be 45 by 152 feet. It will be divided into three sections for a departmentalized Sunday school program on Sundays and a Christian elementary school during the week.

Expected opening of the building this summer will make possible the opening of the lower grades of the elementary school this fall, Rev. Wenske said.

Evangelists to Lead Rites at Calvary Church

In this final series of "Sky Wonders Filmed From Mount Palomar" he invites all to come early for a good seat, for his program on opening night starts at 6:15 Sunday.

Many people all over our nation have said that seeing and hearing a Phillip Knox lecture is like "going sight-seeing" far out over the infinite meadows of heaven.

There is no admission charge. Knox will make a gift of his latest book, "God's Amazing Universe," autographed to those who ask for it Sunday.
