# New Control System Shown **During Navy Weapons Meet**

The Navy's newest and most improved armament control system was demonstrated to top ranking Navy and Marine officers of the Atlantic and Pacific Fleets on a Torrance-produced Douglas F4D Skyray at the Second Annual Naval Air Weapons Meet at El Centro last week.

The system, the Westinghouse Aero 13F, is a unique cylindrically - packaged unit consisting of the AN/APQ-50 Radar, the Aero 5B Armament Control Director (computer), and the AFCS MK-16 Optical System for clear weather and daylight operation.

Storms Pierced Providing for all-weather interception of enemy aircraft, the fire control system is capable of detecting, tracking, and making possible the inevitable, destruction of enemy aircraft at night or in cloudy or stormy weather conditions such as often experienced at sea.

It has equal effectiveness in firing guns, rockets, or the Navy's deadly Sidewinder guided air-to-air missile.

A broadening of the Marine
Corps reserve six-month active

expanded program, organized

are now authorized to enlist
young men between the agea
of 18½ and 21 and assign
them to six months' active
duty for training.

Serve With Reserve
On completion of this active
duty, the reservists complete
the balance of their obligated
military service as members of
their local Marine Corps reserve unit.

High school students enlisting in this program may be
deferred for a period of up to
one year, to enable them to
complete their schooling prior
to performing active duty.

Six-Year Obligation

The new program also carries with it a total military
service obligation of only six
years. The existing six months'
program for those 17 to 18½
years of age carries a total
obligation of eight years. However, it is anticipated that
