Supervisors Will Take Bids for **Dominguez Channel Improvement**

Construction bids for one of the most important flood control projects ever undertaken in the Gardens-Torrance area—permanent improvement of Dominguez channel between Denker and Vermont Aves—will be opened tomorrow, according to County Supervisor Kenneth Hahn.

The work, which will cost an estimated \$2,000,000 will include constructing Dominguez channel between Denker and Vermont Aves. Will be opened tomorrow, according to County Supervisor Kenneth Hahn.

Water Dammed
He pointed out that much of the flooding in the wake of the 1956 January storm was caused by the small culverts under the present bridges across the channel at Normandie and Vermont which dammed the water, causing it to back up.

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
"Water will pass under these new bridges through huge concrete boxes totaling 75 feet in width and approximately 18 feet deep, and this should eliminate this problem," Supervisor Hahn said.
