Thirteen members enjoyed a dinner party recently at which time there was a surprise birthday cake and ice cream honoring Mrs. Robert Kessenich, a charter member.

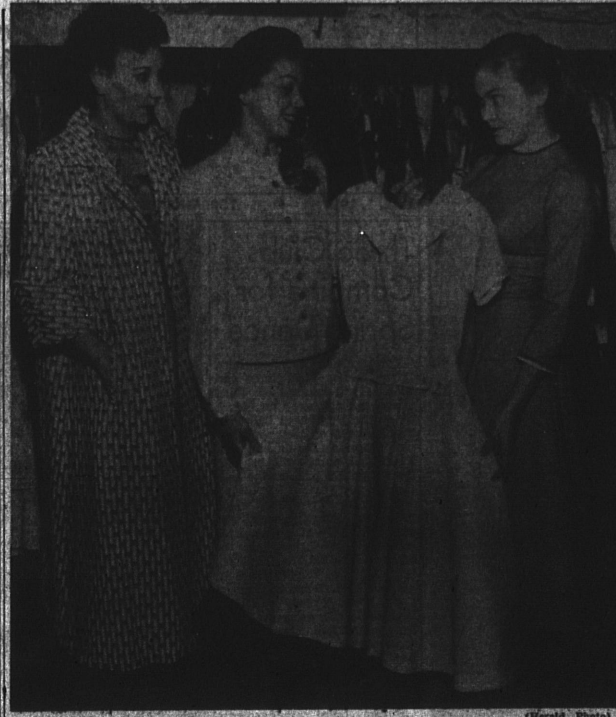
