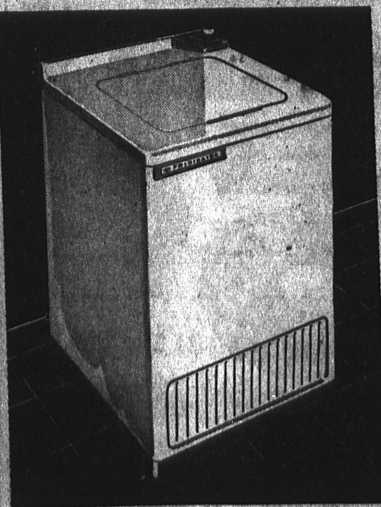

**Area Well Represented During  
Talks on Juvenile Delinquency**

On Monday of this week the mayor's committee on juvenile delinquency conducted the Town Meeting requested by Gov. Knight. This was the second of two open meetings and definitely was not as well attended as it should have been. However, the people of North Torrance were well represented. I counted more than 30 whom I knew were from this area. North High was ably represented by its Student Body president and vice president. Now I know that this meeting will be ably reported by trained people, but the subject is of such importance that I must record my impressions and reactions. It was repeatedly brought out that the need for emotional maturity in both students and parents was basic; that the family relationship essential to developing this emotional maturity is the responsibility of parents and that reaching those who most need help in this direction is often very difficult. The need for activities where young adults can be adult and find expression of their interests as in hobby clubs, co-educational social activities and in churches was touched upon. It is evident that Torrance needs a Teen-Age Center (really several). Something is being done in this direction and your cooperation will be asked for when needed. See that you respond. Another recurrent point was the need for publicizing good qualities and good deeds of young people. It is of course true that wrongdoings are more interesting reading than right. My response to this is that I will try, as long as I write this column, to mention each week some desirable action on the part of our young people. Could we not all start a "whispering campaign" in this direction.
