The Franchise Tax Board is sending a reminder today to any non-profit organization wishing to remain exempt from payment of California corporate franchise taxes to be certain to file a loyalty declaration on Form 99 prior to March 15. Failure to file the statement amounts to an automatic waiver of the right to exemption the Board said.

Organizations that do not receive the necessary forms through the mails are advised to obtain them at one of the branch offices of the Franchise Tax Board or at 1020 N St. Sacramento.
