The equipment, which was rigged up and test operated at National Supply's Torran ce plant prior to shipment, arrived in Yokohama in January, and was scheduled to be shipped to the Higashi Nagaoka atra at the end of Japan's raily season. It may possibly be used in off-shore drilling.

First Since War
This is the first complete rig purchased by the Japanese oil industry since 1937. At that time, Japanese interests purchased a large steam rig from The National Supply Co. for the O. S. Army, under direction of ScAP, shipped a rig to Japan, but this was returned to the United States unused.

The decision to seek oil at greater depth is the outgrowth of geological and geophysical studies conducted by American technicians during the time of the Allied Occupation of Japan Subsequently the Telikou Oil Co. expanded its own studies along these lines, and is understood to have located numerous structures that are considered favorable to the possible discovery of toll. cial risks of exploratory drilling.

Ins. Fields Exploited
Prior to World War II. the fapanese government established the Telkoku Oil Co., owned half privately and half by the government, and gave it a virtual monopoly of production.
