

Tax Collector Has a Heart, Kirkwood Says

Proof that even income tax collectors have a heart was furnished today by Robert C. Kirkwood, Chairman of the Franchise Tax Board.

"Taxpayers who are not able to file their State income tax returns by the deadline of April 16 may apply for an extension," Kirkwood said.

To obtain an extension, application in triplicate should be made on Form 17001 and filed with the Franchise Tax Board on or before April 16. A concise statement of reasons for the extension must be included in the application, Kirkwood said.

Extensions are granted for a period of 90 days unless a longer period is requested. Except for taxpayers who are abroad, a time extension for filing the return may not be granted for longer than six months," declared Kirkwood.

Forms for making application for extension may be obtained from the local office of the Franchise Tax Board, Room 206, State Building, First and Broadway, or by writing the Franchise Tax Board, 1020 N Street, Sacramento 14.

Reality of Sin Lesson-Sermon Topic Yesterday

The Lesson-Sermon in all Christian Science churches yesterday was on the topic "Are Sin, Disease, and Death Real?"

A passage from the Bible read by the second reader spoke of the spiritual comfort given to Job. In his grief these words are spoken to him, "If there be a messenger with him, an interpreter, one among a thousand, to shew unto man his uprightness: Then he is gracious unto him, and saith, Deliver him from going down to the pit: I have found a ransom. His flesh shall be fresher than a child's: . . . and his life shall see the light" (Job 33:23-25, 28).

The first reader read correlative passages from "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy, one of which declares: "All reality is in God and His creation, harmonious and eternal. Therefore the only reality of sin, sickness, or death is the awful fact that unrealities seem real to human, erring belief, until God strips off their disguise" (p. 472).

The Golden text for the sermon was from Psalms (18:27,28): "Thou wilt save the afflicted people; for thou wilt light my candle: the Lord my God will enlighten my darkness."
