

REGISTRATION DEADLINE

Today is the final day to register for the June 5 presidential primary elections, City Clerk A. H. Bartlett warned vesterday.

Residents of the Torrance-Lomita area who have changed their address, name, or party affiliation since registering or who failed to vote in the last general election must re-register to be eligible, the City Clerk

said.

Registrars at the City Hall, 1511 Cravens Ave., will be open this evening for the convenience of workers who are unable to register during the day. Deputies throughout the city will be available in their homes throughout the day and evening to register potential voters, Bartlett said.
