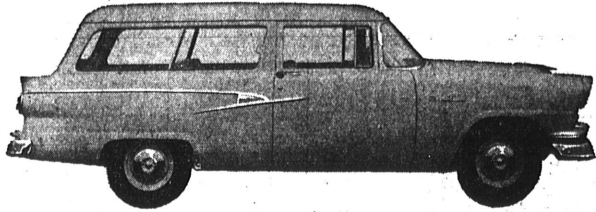

New officers of Baanim Bonim, senior youth group of Temple Israel, will be installed May 11 in connection with the opening of the new temple, at 6214

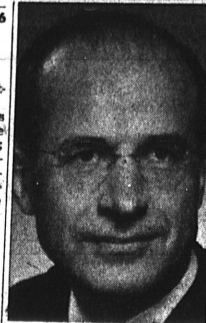
