Three local sailors arrived back from duty with the Pacific Fleet Friday after the completion of the first phase of training exercises.

They are due to ship out again today for further duty. The exercise involves 35 ships and 15,000 personnel in coordinated fleet and task force operations with anti-air warfare and air defense as the principal objectives.

The 35 ships will be berthed at San Francisco, Oakland and Alameda. Open house, which was held aboard the ships over the week end, included an invitation for the public to attend church services yesterday morning.

The First Fleet, commanded by Vice Admiral Herbert G. Hopwood, USN, is the Eastern Pacific's counterpart of the Western Pacific's Seventh Fleet. The primary mission of the First Fleet is the coordination of training of fleet units for combat readiness before deployment to distant duty.
