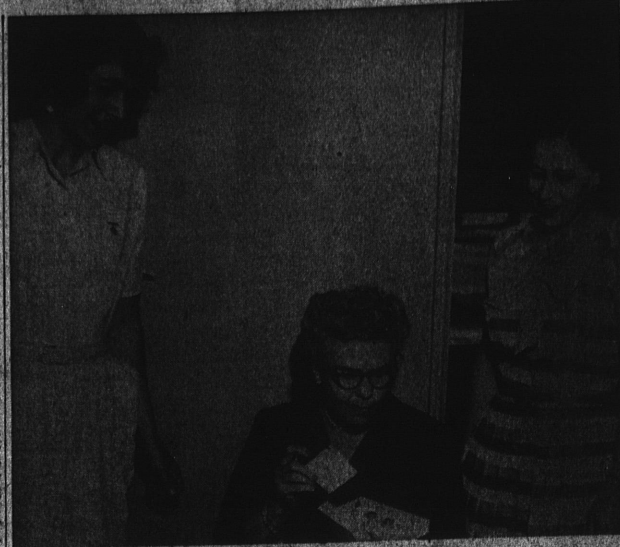
RECITAL SLATED FOR SUNDAY
