New Promotion Group Moves On Four Fronts

The Torrance Chamber of Commerce's new advertising and publicity committee is making progress on four different fronts, it was reported here yesterday by Chairman Gerald M. Eastham, M.D.

1. Roy M. Burns is investigating use by Trade Journals of special stories about Torrance as an industrial center.

2. Willys Blount and King Williams are to investigate and make recommendations on the use of paid space advertising in national media.

3. Walter A. Garrabrant is concentrating on getting full use of the revised film, "Torrance, City of Industrial Opportunity."

4. Don Hyde, W. R. Zappas, and Jack Phillips have already made an initial survey on the places additional signs to mark the entrance to Torrance and to direct persons to Torrance.

City officials reported at the same time that the placing of boundary signs had become a city responsibility on July 1, and that additional signs would be ordered immediately.

The committee was set up recently by Chamber President John Ebbinghouse to pursue a program of promoting Torrance.

Conciliator Keeps Drug Talks Going

Arbitration between the Retail Clerks' Union and the Harbor Area Employers' Council continued yesterday afternoon under the direction of John Condon, of the California State Conciliation Service.

Representatives of the union and council are negotiating over the proposed extension of the new chain drug firm contract to 28 independent drug stores in the harbor area.

Condon was called in for the negotiations Tuesday morning by Retail Clerks' Secretary Ben Scott, after a meeting on Monday between the employers and union representatives failed to iron out differences.

The union is asking extension of the five-year contract agreed on by Southland chain drug firms to the independent drug stores.

According to Frank Selover, secretary of the Employers' Council, the independent drug stores want to stand by their separate contracts which reflect the differences between them and the chain stores.
